

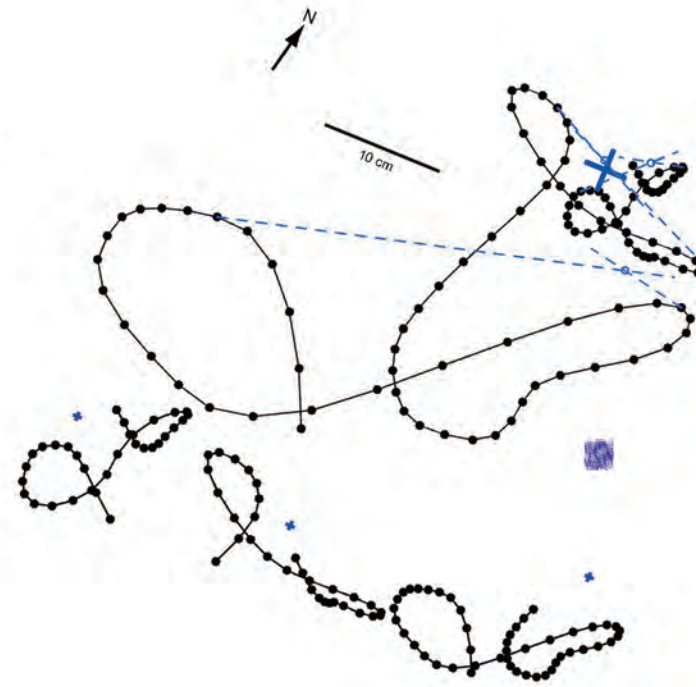
# Voracious Pollinators

This is a garden all about finding one's way as determined by such pollinators as the bumble bee. It is a place for play as an exploration, defined by the transient visitor whether they are a human child, adult, or insect.

Voracious Pollinators consists of three interconnected elements:

- A) A series of intertwining pathways based on a bumblebee's multiple flight patterns;
- B) A prominent rise and dip in elevation formed by a mound and burrow, located in two distinct areas of the site. The mound rises to a height of 2 meters, whereas the burrow is 1.25 meters deep, constructed as if peeling back a layer of land. Each feature has niche-like areas studded with nests of bumble bee nectar pods, made of yellow tinted fibreglass;
- C) A dense, meadow-like planting of perennials and annuals allows for a variety of plant heights, foliage textures, colour of blooms, and smell, within the pathway plan. The plant list is diverse, determined by what are pollinator-friendly throughout the summer and fall months.

Together the three components form a nectar rich habitat, ripe for discovery.
