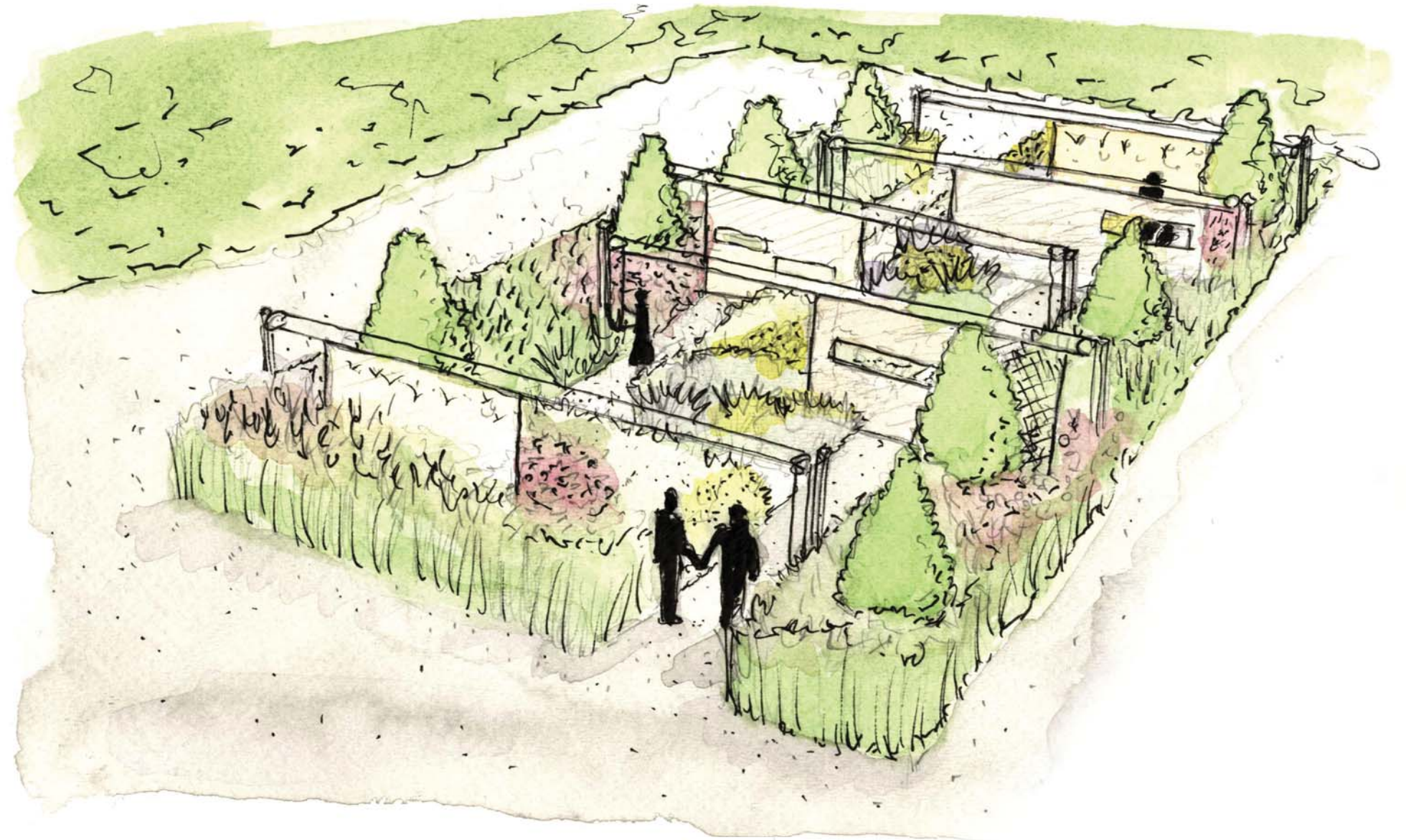


PATCHWORK

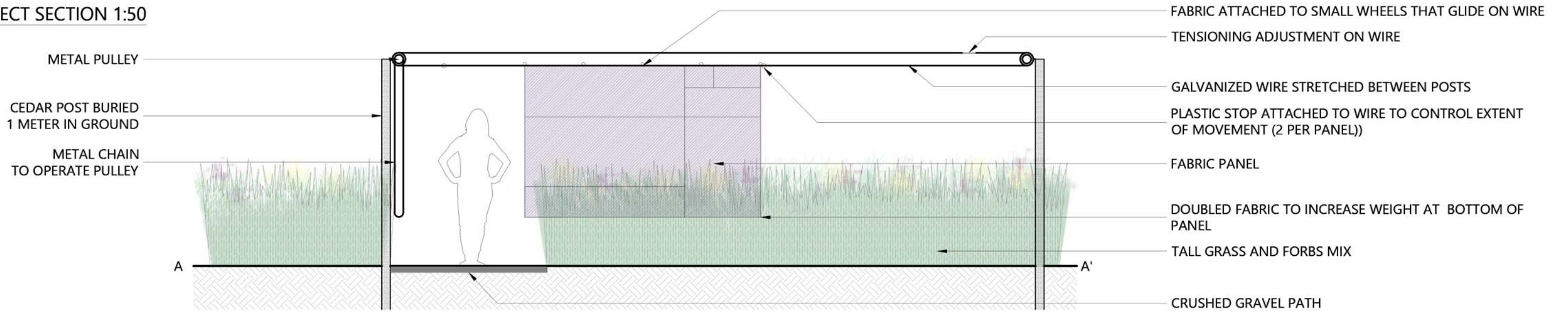
Patchwork is an ever-changing quilt formed by cloth, plants, wind, sun, and people. Children and adults play by moving panels of cloth back and forth through the garden on a pulley system. New rooms to explore are created and disappear, and views across the garden continuously change. Wind moves the panels and plants. Sunlight casts shadows of the trees and plants on to the cloth. Plants at times are hidden by cloth, and at other times cast shadows across them.

Drawings of wildlife embedded in the cloth move in and out of the garden, and are hidden and revealed as children and adults pull the chain of the pulleys. The drawings in the garden suggest pieces of a story that change as they move to different locations and change order.

The plants in the garden are a patchwork of grasses, perennials and trees that play with each other and with the cloth above. Dense plantings interact with each other and change in size, texture and color through the year. The colors of the garden change from the bright greens and purples and yellows of the summer to browns and tans of the fall. The flowers of spring and summer turn to seed heads that wave in the wind.
