



### Garden of Nothing

*The Garden of Nothing is a place for noticing how life happens without our direction, and an experiment in making gardens with very few resources.*

*With increasing demands on our time, and on the earth's resources, perhaps today's garden is better used as a place to let natural processes occur, rather than a place to exert control over our environment. Before asking 'how do we do things more sustainably?', this garden asks, 'what happens if we do less?'. If we aren't so busy trying to control our environment, perhaps we will be left with more time to play in our gardens.*

*The Garden of Nothing is a gravel path surrounded by bare soil. Both the soil and gravel are collected from the Jardins de Metis. The soil is left loose and whatever vegetation grows, grows. At first, the garden is formed by the contrast of plants that sprout from the seedbank against the gravel path. Over time the garden becomes taller and envelops the visitor as taller plants fill the garden.*
